We would like to remind students that it is a privilege to wear their own clothes to school. While the day will have a relaxed dress code, it is still a normal school day, and students are required to bring all the necessary equipment. This includes:

- School bag
- PE kit (if applicable)
- Appropriate footwear
- Fully charged iPad
- Any stationery required for lessons

Please note the following items are not acceptable on a non-uniform day:

- Crop tops
- Baseball caps or any other hats
- Crocs or sliders
- High heels
- Piercings (including facial, navel, upper ear, tongue, lip, and nose)
- Bralettes
- Jewellery
- Offensive or inappropriate imagery, including sexual content or language

Hair colour and extreme styles must also comply with the school's usual rules. Weather-appropriate clothing is essential, so please ensure that your child dresses appropriately for the conditions on the day.

This list is not exhaustive, and the school reserves the right to use its discretion in determining whether a student's attire is appropriate for school. If a student is deemed to be inappropriately dressed, we will contact parents/carers to provide alternative clothing.
