At Arthur Terry School we strive to ensure all our students have opportunities to excel, and a place to belong, and will continue to reflect and take appropriate action, to ensure we are always improving the everyday school experience, for all in our learning community. ## **Personal Development**

To support students' personal development, Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship and Economic education (PSHCE) is taught throughout the school in every year group by form tutors and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. At the start of this academic year parents were contacted to share our PSHCE programme. Our programme aims to give young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential. In addition, the programme includes the new, statutory Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education requirements.

Topics are embedded across the PSHCE programme for each year group as part of a spiral curriculum which introduces students to age-appropriate material, including teaching about: Healthy relationships, including friendships and intimate relationships; families; growing and changing, including puberty; personal hygiene; changing feelings; becoming more independent; keeping safe and consent; developing self-esteem and confidence. All PSHCE teaching will take place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values: Be Proud, Be Kind, Be Ready.
