Results:

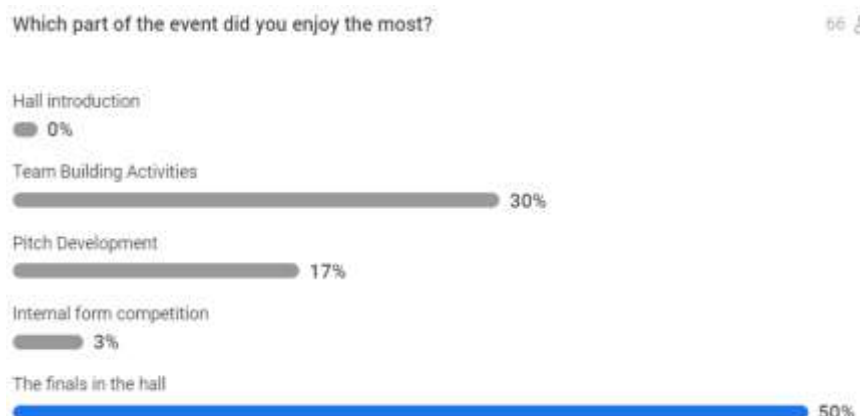
Question One: Did you enjoy the RGWM experience of the workplace challenge?
