Successful teaching and learning will not only see students of all prior attainments and individual contexts (especially vulnerable learners) achieve their best in final examinations, but also formulate their own reasoned judgements on issues, rationally arguing their case and rebutting opponents'. We want to stimulate a passion for politics in our students by linking the course to national and world events, and inspire them to create the change they want to see in the world, motivating them to engage politically beyond the curriculum, whether through their MP, a political party, a single-issue group, or by educating others.
