

### What does a Form Tutor do?



- 1st person each student sees each day
- Establishes morning routines and checks equipment
- Monitors behaviour, attendance and academic progress and intervenes as appropriate
- Delivers personal development programme
- 1st point of contact for parents and students to support if issues arise



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## What does a *Progress Leader* do?



- Oversees the form tutors
- Monitors attendance, behaviour and academic progress
- Provides an additional more strategic layer of support and intervention

The first port of call for you will always be the form tutor via the enquiry@arthurterry.bham.sch.uk





# Organisation and equipment

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- Full equipment list is on the website
- Students must carry a reading book with them at all times, which will mainly be used during tutor time.

Students are able to use the Praise Points to purchase items in our Praise & Rewards Kiosk.

The average number of Praise Points amongst Year 7 students in the 2022/23 academic year is nearly 150, with the highest individual total in the school at a massive 419!



#### Logging on

To be able to use Go For Schools you will need to request a password, by following the steps below:

Step One: Visit www.go4schools.com and



click on the "Parents" link in the top righthand corner

Step two: Enter your

email address into the "First-time User?" section and click the "Please send me a password" button. This must be the email address that the school has.

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Step three: You will now receive a password via your email account. Enter this into the "Password" box in the "Welcome" section, along with your email address into the "Email address" box. Finally, click the "Log in" button to gain access.

If this is not possible, parents should notify the Attendance Team prior to the appointment by emailing attendance@arthurterry.bham.sch.uk



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
