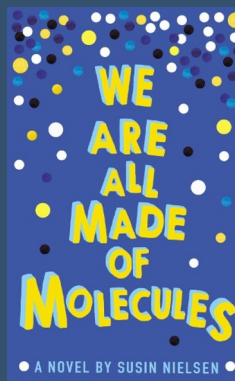
Murder Most Unladylike– Robin Stevens

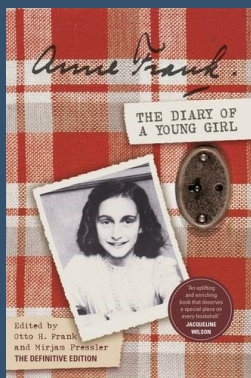
Wonder– R J Palacio

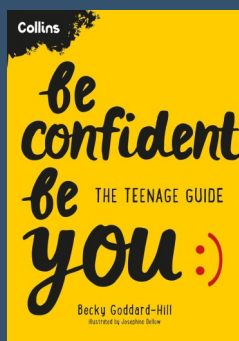
We Are All Made of Molecules– Susin Neilson

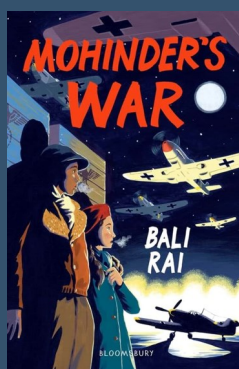
Be Confident, Be You– Becky Goddard-Hill

This positive and insightful guide gives you the tools to build your confidence, self-esteem, and embrace opportunities in all areas of your life.



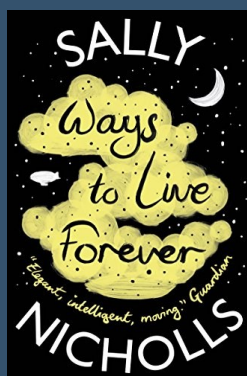
The Boy who Grew Dragons– Andy Shepherd

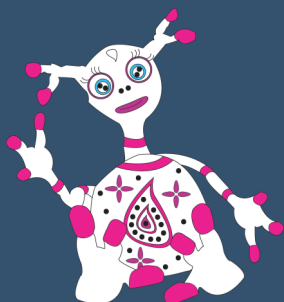
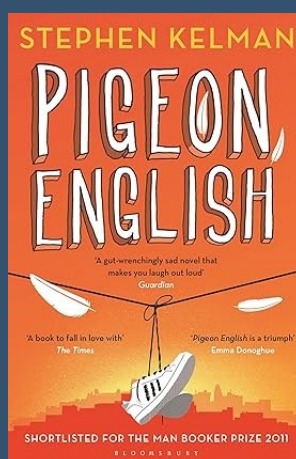
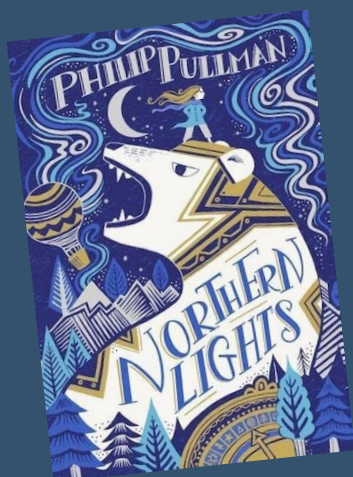
