Dear Parents/Carers,

Red Nose Day – Friday 21st March 2025.

To raise funds for Red Nose Day, we will be hosting a whole school non-uniform day on Friday 21st March. In addition to the non-uniform day, we will be holding a cake sale in the atrium at lunchtime.

We would welcome any contributions by either baking or donating treats for this sale.

To comply with our school policy, we must ask that all ingredients are listed for both bought and home baked cakes and clearly visible. Please also ensure that your donations are nut free. Cakes without ingredients listed will not be able to be sold.

Students who wish to purchase items, must bring a small amount of cash. All funds generated from the cake sale will also go directly to Comic Relief.

Non- Uniform Day

This is a fantastic opportunity for students to express their individuality while contributing to a very worthy cause. All funds raised will go directly to Comic Relief, supporting disadvantaged people from around the world.

To participate, parents/carers are asked to donate via ParentPay, with a minimum contribution of £2. Please visit the donation point on ParentPay if you wish for your child to take part and wear non-uniform on the day.

We would like to remind students that it is a privilege to wear their own clothes to school. While the day will have a relaxed dress code, it is still a normal school day, and students are required to bring all the necessary equipment. This includes:

- School bag
- PE kit (if applicable)
- Appropriate footwear
- Fully charged iPad
- Any stationery required for lessons

Please note the following items are not acceptable on a non-uniform day:

- Crop tops
- Baseball caps or any other hats
- Crocs or sliders
- High heels
- Piercings (including facial, navel, upper ear, tongue, lip, and nose)

- Bralettes
- Jewellery
- Offensive or inappropriate imagery, including sexual content or language

Hair colour and extreme styles must also comply with the school's usual rules. Weather-appropriate clothing is essential, so please ensure that your child dresses appropriately for the conditions on the day.

This list is not exhaustive, and the school reserves the right to use its discretion in determining whether a student's attire is appropriate for school. If a student is deemed to be inappropriately dressed, we will contact parents/carers to provide alternative clothing.
