


What does a Form Tutor do?

- First point of contact for parents and students to support if issues arise





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
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What does a **Progress Leader** do?

- We are a big school with over 1750 students.
- There will be over 280 students in Year 7 and the Year 7 team will do their upmost to support the students as they settle.
- The first port of call for you will always be the form tutor via the enquiry@arthurterry.bham.sch.uk
- **BUT** there will be lost pencil cases, lost PE kits, lost mobile phones. We cannot find all that is lost.
- **BUT** new friendships forming and old friendships fading is normal. We cannot fix friendships as they evolve.
- **BUT** we can monitor what they do on school devices we cannot police what they do on their own phones.

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Reporting, Assessment and Parents' Evenings



Baseline tests:

Variety of assessments in the first term such as CAT4 tests and reading level assessments. Information is used to identify specific areas to focus on in the academic year.

Assessment weeks:

Three times a year, all students take part in an Assessment week for all subjects. Information is used to track progress and identify areas of misunderstanding. The experience helps develop student resilience for formal, GCSE examinations in Year 11

Parents/carers evening and reports:

Online appointments, Assessment and attributes data, tutor report Information supports parent/carer support of student's progress.



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

Organisation and equipment



- Full equipment list is on the website.
- Students must carry a reading book with them at all times, which will mainly be used during tutor time.
- If your child struggles with organisation, we suggest using a paper planner.
- The Maths department do expect all students to have a Casio calculator. We strongly recommend that you purchase a Scientific one.
 - You will need help at first to pack your bag each evening,
 - Pack only the items needed for the next day. Not everything!
 - Be careful of the two week timetable!
 - Keep all school books and equipment in ONE place at home.

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Digital Strategy



- In September Year 7 students will receive an ipad and charger




Biggest threat to our young people's health and happiness...



Risk of:

- Disengagement with surroundings
- Limits engagement in other activities
- Peer pressure
- · Rumours and gossip
- · Typing before thinking
- Oversharing
- Impact on cognitive functioning
- Reduced sleep
- Poorer emotional regulation
- Interaction with unknown people
- Exposure to inappropriate material





Emerging issues with Online Safety

- Main social media platforms have 13 Years + age range
- Often secondary school is when students begin to gain greater access to all the functions of smart phones and the internet.



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

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
